Sharon Alderman's *Mastering Weave Structures, Transforming Ideas into Great Cloth* will take you through variations on plain weave, twills, satin, waffle weave, the distorted grid, compound weaves, loom-controlled doubleweave, Bedford cords and piques, loom-controlled pile weaves, crepe weaves, and on to inventing your own weave structures. Whether you are weaving on 2-shafts, 3-shafts, 4-shafts, 5-shafts, 6-shafts up to 24-shafts, Ms. Alderman will walk you through the structure and provide the draft for the various options. The illustrations are abundant and beautiful.

The appendices include how to turn a draft (e.g., the design may run crosswise, and you would like for it to go lengthwise); decipher industrial drafts (generally older books); and calculate setts (for the uninitiated, the number of wraps in an inch is an over simplification).

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The "Warped Weavers" met Thursday, October 24 (the fourth Thursday of the month) at the studio for our regular monthly gathering. Kathie Phoenix gave us a demonstration on how to warp a loom. She had wound some beautiful warp for a scarf she is going to start and showed us how to get started with warping on the studio's Baby Wolf loom. Then we moved over to a table loom that was warped but had had the weaving cut off and she demonstrated how to tie the warp onto the front beam and then wind it on by yourself. She answered many questions during the demonstration. Just being able to see how to handle the warp rather than having to read the book and translate it into actually tying on made each step appear so much simpler and quicker. With the addition of others' experienced advice it was a great session and it passed much too quickly.

This will be our last Thursday session until the new year. The 4th Thursday of November is Thanksgiving and then we'll be busy with Christmas so be ready to get going again on the 4th Thursday of January! However, we do have one activity planned for November. On November 18, we are continuing our tour of looms at people's homes so we can see what they are doing. We will gather at 9:30 at Carol Lyle's house to see her great -grandmother's rug loom. At 10:30 - 11:00 we will go to Laurel Calhoun's and see the "new" (to her!) loom she purchased this fall. There is a video on warping that we are going to show also. Please plan on coming if you are able. It will be interesting and fun and we'll get to see some more great projects! As the time gets closer, I'll send out a reminder and the addresses.

If anybody has any ideas for classes or weaving projects or anything else to do with weaving, please let me know. We are always looking for something new to do and ideas to keep us going!

The Warped Weavers will not meet in November or December. They will, however, be going strong come January with their regularly scheduled meeting on Thursday, January 23 at 1:30 at the Studio.
