<u>The Twisted Sisters Sock Workbook</u> by Lynne Vogel is a fun, well-illustrated work that will take you from choosing roving, dyeing, spinning, plying, and then turning your yarn into beautiful socks.

The twisted sisters is a group of knitters in Eugene, Oregon whose love of fiber has led them far beyond knitting. Ms. Vogel walks the reader through both the technical process of creating the yarns as well as the artistic process of choosing the colors and determining how to combine them. The twisted sisters have taken these fibers and turned them into fabulous socks, truly a feast for your eyes.

The book is full of great information (including a technique for testing your ideas by starting with simple tube socks, and then transforming those socks into a one-of-a-kind project for someone you love.

<u>Happenings in the Guild Library</u> There have been a few changes in the library:

The books are set up by category (e.g., Knitting, Spinning, Weaving) and are organized alphabetically by title within those sections. There is a list of the library books in a folder on the top right mailbox on the table where you check-out materials. Each book and DVD has a card in it for checkout, and the simple (and probably obvious) procedure is posted over the table.

The magazines will soon be organized by date with the years posted on the outside of the box.
