In at the Guild library —check it out

Finally, almost hot of the presses (okay, some of you have probably had it since 2012), the Guild has acquired *The Spinner's Book of Yarn Designs* (*Techniques for Creating 80 Yarns*) by Sarah Anderson (thanks for the suggestion CJ). It is a beautiful book, with stunning color photo after, color photo.

I am not a spinner, but I will try to give you a sense of this book. Ms. Anderson makes it clear that this is not a book about how to spin. "It is for spinners who want to learn *more* about spinning and try something different." She clarifies that she is sharing her experiences and opinions. The book covers spinning basics, singles for plying, stand-alone singles, spiral yarns, opposing plies, boucles, cable yarns, cree yarns, core yarns, and novelty yarns.

In the back are 64 unique reference cards designed to be kept by your wheel for reference (in this case, of course, only for a few weeks).

Upon learning that the Guild was going to purchase this book, several people commented on what a good book it is; so if you are, or are contemplating becoming, a spinner, I hope you will check it out. You can find it in the Spinning section of the Guild library, in what is occasionally alphabetical order by title.

Warped Weavers

The Warped Weavers are all happily weaving away. Members report that they are enjoying the challenges of a new weave and using two shuttles. So I got to thinking about my weaving. What do I enjoy in weaving. Many people find that one weave is so interesting that they spend years just investigating everything about that one weave. Others, and I am one of these types of people, like to try a new weave and then another and another. I have done nearly two dozen different weaves over the past 16 years. Some I really love and revisit frequently. Overshot is one of those. I am fascinated with watching the pattern appear. Other weaves I am glad I haven't invested too much time on. I am not a fan of waffle weave. But the jury is still out on some weaves. Crackle is one of those. The first crackle project was a set of towels. They were fun and turned out well. I did them in cottolin and the hand of the fabric is really great. They make wonderful kitchen towels. The crackle scarf that I am working on right now is not as much fun. I haven't figured out what about it I don't like. The treadling is really easy. I love working with tencel, but for some reason I just am not thrilled with what I am creating. So this project is one of those ones that will teach me about me. It will be a time of learning what brings me joy in the creative process.

So let me encourage you, whether you are a weaver or not. Whatever your artform/hobby is, try new things....push the bounds. Learn more about what you are doing and at the same time learn something new about yourself. And if you don't like something in the whole process, change it and make it something wonderful.






