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In at the Guild library —check it out

The Guild library has benefited from many recent donations. Among them are *Fabric Painting* by Miranda Innes, *Socks from the Toe Up* by Wendy Johnson, and *2-ata-Time Socks* and *Toe-Up 2-ata-Time Socks*, both by Melissa Morgan-Oakes.

Fabric Painting, by Miranda Innes, was donated by CJ Godfrey. Ms. Innes covers painting and dyeing, printing, and gutta and wax-resist. The illustrations are beautiful and inspiring. For those who are like me and ignorant about gutta, it is a thick latex substance used mainly for painting on silk using the serti technique. It comes in clear, black, gold and silver metallic, and several colors.

Ms. Innes includes a list of basic materials and equipment. She explores basic techniques such as making silk screens and fixing paints and dyes. In the section on painting and dyeing, she includes beautiful, vibrantly colored projects, including Painted Jungle, Stylish Striped Scarf, and Bold Felt Blocks. The printing section has directions for Leafy Sheer Silk, Easy Potato Print, and Marbled Silk. The gutta and wax-resist used to control the color on fabric, form an impenetrable barrier, and that section includes directions for Glowing Squares, Tropical Seascape, and Aquatik Batik. She ends the book with Ideas to Inspire – beautiful photographs of colorful projects you can make.

Warped Weavers

Summer is upon us. The grass is growing like crazy, the weeds in the garden are growing....well, like weeds. And I am told that this weekend that the temperatures are going to be close to 80 degrees. So many of us are off on travels to new and exciting places. With all the busy-ness of summer, the Warped Weavers have decided to suspend meetings for the summer and let members finish up with their crackle projects. But we also decided to embark on a new adventure. Each member is encouraged to investigate a weave structure of their choice. Something that they admire or want to know more about. For our meeting on August 19 we would like each of us to report on the weave of their choice; it's history, how it is structured, what it can be used for. Then we want to know what you plan to make with it. This weave structure with then be your fall project. You might choose to make towels in a twill, or a overshot table runner, or something in summer/winter. Your summer "research" would then be on that twill, overshot or summer/winter weave structure. Articles in Handwoven on that structure would be a great place to start. There are lots of books on different weave structures, not to mention the internet. If you are having a problem finding information, don't hesitate to ask one of the other members of the Warped weavers because they may have run across exactly what you are hunting for. I have my eye on a Swedish snowflake pattern that I saw in the book Best of Weavers Twill Thrills. So have fun finishing your crackle project and looking for something that is new and exciting and we will see you in August.
