Rug Hooking News

As I was preparing for a recent trip, I needed a project to take along. I had the small knitting project organized - a smallish knit cowl using wooden points on circular needles so there would be no question for the TSA at airline security. So I arrived at a plan to be able to take a small rug hooking project. I'll explain the accompanying pictures. The linen pattern is about 12" x 12". I found my rug hooking hoop that makes the project more portable than a rug hooking frame. I quickly selected wool that I thought would work and cut it to get it ready. I fixed zip-lock sandwich bags by using some painters masking tape to reinforce the corners and then punched a hole through the layers. I did enough bags to have each color in its own bag. I found a carabineer of an appropriate size and threaded the bags onto it to keep things together. I found some little folding scissors, got my rug hook and stuffed it all into a 2 gallon zip lock bag. I could squeeze the air out of that bag and was able to come up with quite a compact lightweight project! I actually worked on the hooking project several times during our trip, giving me that moment of relaxation and creativity I needed at the time.

As a reminder, our rug hooking group meets at the studio on the 4th Wednesday of the month from 1-3 PM. If you have any questions, you can contact me at 208-522-3872.

We are getting a group rug hooking project organized to eventually donate at the Fiber Arts Fair for 2017. We have the pattern selected and enlarged and have already started to collect some



yarn and wool for that project. If you're wondering about rug hooking or need help, please plan to join us. Of course we're a fun helpful group!

If you've thought about exploring band weaving, *Band Weaving*; *The Techniques. Looms, and Uses for Woven Bands* by Harold and Sylvia Tacker can provide you with a wealth of information about the history (albeit brief) of band weaving as well as instruction on many band weaving techniques.

The Tackers explore simple finger-woven bands, soda-straw loom bands, Hungarian-loom bands, twining-loom bands, rigid-heddle bands, band weaving on the American Inkle loom, card-woven bands, and weaving variations for special effects.

The book was published in 1974 and contains only a small section of colored photographs (which I must confess always draw me in). Though many of the fashions illustrated in the book are outdated (and the hairstyles!), the techniques are well illustrated.

I've made a card board box inkle loom (It worked well but was very limited in the length of band that could be made and the number of times it could be used – somehow cardboard just doesn't hold up like wood!?!?). I've also tried the Guild's inkle loom. It just seemed too tedious for me, one of little patience.

I'm in need of a band for a waffle weave towel I made (and have been in need for a year, maybe two, give or take). I don't have the requisite number of cards to make the band per instructions with the towel, so I'm hoping to find my answer here. When I am ready to make the band, I'll be checking this book out again

Dizzy Spinners – It's March and I'm back in action. After months of pain surgery and recovery, I'm ready to Spin!, teach,

talk and otherwise share my love for this Art/Craft to Guild members and those who come in to see what we are all about.

I'm planning on being at Tuesday evenings in case we have new beginners. — Look forward to a class on learning to spin other wheels than your own. It's not hard, but there are a few principles to follow — with these in place — you can spin well on

another wheel.

As Spring continues to come to East Idaho, future spinning workshops that are on the third Thursday of the month will be:

- How to use a drum carder to get what you want.
- Silk in all of its wonder and elegance
- Spinning from roving vs. top

Review of worsted, woolen and long draw

These are just a few of the upcoming workshops. In March we will be looking at the drum carder and how to use it to blend and customize your fiber for that special yarn.

Lace Knitting Class for Intermediate Knitters:


