In at the Guild library —check it out

Magazines, issues both old and new, are available for checkout from the Guild. Three of them are:

Each issue of "Handwoven," published five times a year, includes complete directions for about ten projects that can be selected by weave structure; shaft requirement, i.e., tablet weaving, rigid heddle, 4 shaft, 8 shaft, etc.; and/or skill level. Articles include topics such as new weaving tools and books and weaving traditions within various cultures. Each issue has a theme, such as upcoming issues on Weaving Dark and Light, Handwoven Celebrations, and Thick and Thin.

"Spin-Off" is published four times a year by Interweave. The issue I looked at included directions for Country Summer Shawl, Spring Hope Shawl, Autumn Leaves Scarf and Shawl. The projects run the gamut of knitted, crocheted, woven; so it could be a resource for more than spinners. This issue included articles entitled Spindle Hook Alignment, Spindle Survival Kit, The Weighty Matter of Spindles; Winding Well; the Butterfly Effect, Explore the Blending Board; Quick on the Uptake; Tips for Buying an Antique or Second Hand Wheel; Finding Balance, The Yarn Project, and more.

"Interweave Knits" is published four times a year. The Fall, 2015 issue included 15 projects – sweaters, shawls, socks, hats. You'll also find a yarn review, information on a wool community in Yorkshire England, a book review, and advanced approaches to slip-stitch colorwork.
