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In at the Guild library —check it out

Some recent donations to the Guild library include: *Teach Yourself Visually Handspinning* donated by CJ Godfrey; *Learn to Weave with Anne Field* and *The Big Book of Weaving* both donated by Mary Ellen Anderson.

It's time to be thinking about those Christmas projects (hopefully not past time), and *Crochet 101 Snowflakes* by Delsie Rhoades and Kathy Wesley will help you do just that. There are, indeed, 101 beautiful crocheted snowflakes to make. They range from the ethereal to the substantial, but what they all have in common is beauty.

Ms. Rhoades and Ms. Wesley begin with the basics of materials and technique. First, a short primer on steel crochet hooks and some of the minor challenges one might experience if new to crocheting with steel hooks and fine threads. And detailed instructions on starching and blocking. All of the stitches used are standard crochet stitches (e.g., single, half double, double, triple crochet). Once you get the hang of using the steel crochet hooks and the fine threads, crocheting the snowflakes is fairly quick, and hence readily rewarding.

Check it out!

The Warped Weavers are super excited and ready to weave. Members of the weavers study group have accepted a challenge to weave something in Summer and Winter. This weave structure is a simple and very old 2-tie unit weave that is named after the fact that the traditional style is predominately dark on one side and light on the other. Many of the old items in this weave depict trees around the edge and a field of snowballs in the center. But modern Summer and Winter is bold and colorful. The members of the group are planning to weave kitchen towels, table runners or scarves; whatever they choose in colors of their choice. The one request is that everyone makes 2 identical items; one to keep and one to donate for the guild to sell.

We as a guild are so fortunate to have a studio and a variety of equipment and each member can help us keep this place to meet, have classes and to escape. By donating an item that you have created the guild can hopefully earn enough to pay the rent on the studio. The Warped Weavers encourage all the other study groups to take up the challenge, to make something to sell to help support the studio. If you are not a part of any of the study groups, please look at some of your creations or plan something that you can make to help.

The Warped Weavers are also planning a Warp rep project on the Cranbrook loom that everyone is planning and will have a chance to learn how to weave on that beautiful loom. The "Finish the rug" group has agreed to loan the loom to the Warped Weavers while they work on a color study on one of the Baby Wolf looms.

If you are interested in weaving, come join us on the third Wednesday of each month at 9:30 in the morning at the studio. Happy weaving,

The Future of the Fiber Arts Fair

The Weaving, Spinning, & Fiber Arts Guild has produced the Snake River Fiber Arts Fair for 22 years. After much deliberation, the Guild's Board of Directors has decided to forego producing the Fair for a period of time. For the present, the focus of the Guild is on our education mission by hosting a number of study groups and offering a variety of classes throughout the year.

This decision has been a difficult one to make. It's been hard work, but has brought a lot to our Guild as well as to our community. It began as a way of bringing various fiber-related suppliers to Idaho Falls. Over the years, it evolved into so much more. It brought many types of fiber craft classes from quality instructors, showcased Guild member treasures in the Gallery, provided lively entertainment, and provided a comfortable atmosphere for fiber enthusiasts to come together and share their talents and stories.

Proceeds from the Fair primarily helped fund the rental of our studio space for classes, day and evening open studio times, guild study groups, membership meetings, and storage for our membership rentals: books, magazines, supplies, and equipment. We've been thinking of other ways to fund the rental of the studio space.

If we had more membership interest and involvement, we may consider producing the Fair every two years. It takes months of planning and preparation to produce the quality event you know and enjoy. The past few years, producing the Fair has fallen on the same few members. The Team would love to share their years of experience and mentor anyone who may be interested in chairing, co-chairing, and/or participating in the production of a Fair.
