The book *Encyclopedia of Hand-Weaving* by Stanislaw A. Zielinski is full of hand-weaving terminology, albeit terminology from 1959. I always want to laugh when I read a "contemporary" book that is no longer particularly contemporary, but that doesn't mean that it lacks useful information. That being said, the introduction explains that "harness" in Britain means a set of "leaves" or "shafts" "(the latter in power weaving)" together with the "upper tie-up." "In America 'harness' is nothing else than one 'leaf' or heddle-frame. 'Heddle' means always one 'leash'(or hook, or needle) in America, but in Great Britain it may be used either in the American meaning, or as an equivalent of 'leaf,'" … and on it goes. I had to look up leaf/leaves, and I thought that "harness" was just another name for shaft.

The book if a fun and interesting history of weaving (up until 1959 anyway) and could be very useful if you are reading an older tome or one from another country and wondering what various words meant at the time. I believe that the weaving community is still working on common terminology, and I think in recent years, at least in the United States, has reached some common ground.

Then there is the vocabulary. When twill was described as probably a "derivate of Basket," I found myself asking, "Did Stanislaw mean 'derivative?' Looking up "derivate" (OK, Word looked it up for me), I learned that is the same as derivative. If I were truly a scholar, of course, I would have done some actual research and perhaps learned if "derivate" is still in use, and something more about its history. Regardless, *Encyclopedia of Hand-Weaving* is an interesting look back at the language of weaving and probably useful if you are perplexed by some hand-weaving instructions.


