Interweave's *The Knitter's Companion* by Vicki Square includes a plethora of basic knitting information at your fingertips, some of which you might not even know that you want to know (for example beads, buttonholes, and South American Knitted Join, which turns out to be a way to knit stripes in the round with smooth transitions at the color changes! I didn't know that there was a technique for that! Yes, I don't get out much.).

And beads. I had ordered a book on beaded knitting, and the process has proven far to tedious for me to bother (threading all of the beads onto the skein of yarn in advance). I believe that the technique illustrated in *The Knitter's Companion* is I heard described by some of our illustrious knitting members. Now if I can just find yarn, knitting needles, and beads (and a crochet hook)!

Ms. Square also writes about preparing to knit (supplies, sizes, formula for interchanging yarns, and so on), the basics (continental method, English method, slipped stitches, etc.), as well as cast-ons, joining yarns, increases, decreases, bind-offs, blocking, seaming, hems and hemming (I knit it and now I have to hem it!), details (beads, buttonholes, duplicate stitch...), and other techniques (cables, color knitting, correcting errors - my favorite, and more).

I was pleasantly surprised at how brief directions accompanied by good illustrations can convey so much useful information.



Our thanks to CJ Godfrey for her recent donation of *The Law (In Plain English) for Crafts People* by Leonard D. DuBoff to the Guild library. The book covers various forms of organization (e.g., sole proprietorship, partnership, limited partnership, etc.), trademarks, contracts, consignment, working at home, keeping taxes low, copyright, insurance, product liability, labor relations, on getting paid for your work, how to find a lawyer.

Within those categories there is some interesting history (as well as plenty of useful information) including the use of trademarks and how some guilds required that items include the trademark of the craftsperson so that if there were a problem with the product, it could be traced back to the maker.

The section on copyrights seemed like it might be of particular interest to Guild members who might be considering selling handmade items. US copyright laws have their foundation in the Constitution. There are five exclusive rights under US copyright laws.

The right of first publication.

The right to control the first sale of a work.

The right to reproduce the work once it has been copyrighted.

The right to prepare derivative works based on the copyrighted work.

The right to publicly perform the copyrighted work.

I cannot, however, say that I came away with a clear understanding of how copyright laws do (or do not) determine what Guild members might sell when they have used directions that are presented for example in a magazine such as Handwoven. Some other might be more successful at gleaning that information from the book. So, check it out.
